ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

The MUP program offers flexible scheduling for fulltime and part-time students, with start terms available in the Fall and Spring. Full-time students who begin in the Fall can complete the program in as little as two years, while part-time students typically finish in three to four years. All students complete core courses, choose a specialization with required courses, and take a wide range of electives.

I. DEGREE CORE (18 CREDITS)

II. SPECIALIZATION REQUIREMENTS (9 CREDITS)

Students choose one of the following specializations:

CITY AND COMMUNITY PLANNING

Teaches you the foundation of urban economics, urban planning practice and methods, and spatial analysis.

INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT PLANNING

Prepares you to effectively plan the world's cities by providing you with a deep understanding of the issues, contexts, and organizations at play in international development.

III. ELECTIVES (15 CREDITS)

Select from a diverse range of electives and focus areas to delve deeper into the topics you're most passionate about.

IV. CAPSTONE (3 CREDITS)

In the Capstone Program, students spend a year solving real-world challenges, either working directly with clients or collaborating in small-group research projects.
